Conditions of Entry

- <u>NO</u> refunds after closing date unless a veterinary/doctors certificate supplied. Please refer to the Refund policy on our website for instruction. Should the event be underway and need to be cancelled due to public health order, weather event or any other reason no refunds will be provided, requests for partial refunds may be considered should the event organisers have any surplus income remaining after covering general expenses. If event cancelled before commencement a 20% fee will be retained
- Entry is based on the acceptance of Northern Districts Hack and Dressage Club rules and regulations
- The onus is on the competitor & helpers that they understand the Northern Districts Hack & Dressage Club & Burpengary Equestrian Centre Rules, The organisers have the right to alter the program
- Equestrian Australia rules apply to unless otherwise stated. It is the competitors responsibility to know the rules. All competitors please note that swabbing may occur at any events conducted by this Club. Horses restricted to three (3) tests at two (2) consecutive levels. Competitors must wear boots, gloves & safety approved helmet. Jackets are not compulsory.
- Maximum of 35 horses per class (reserve list may be created).
- Competitors must report to the Gear Steward 10 minutes prior to your allocated time. If riders are happy to ride earlier than their allocated time slot, you are welcome to confer with the Gear Steward on this for your class.
- Riding is to be done in an orderly manner so as not to interfere with other competitors.
- Any disputes are to be directed to the Ground Jury ONLY.
- Please ensure that you leave the grounds clean & tidy. Any yards used MUST have manure/feed etc removed prior to your leaving the grounds, otherwise you will be charged a cleaning fee and bonds not refunded
- All members who are competing can expect to be rostered for pencilling or gear checking. An alternate
 option has been provided if you do not provide a helper to pay a \$50 levy fee. Jobs will be allocated &
 you will be advised on the draw.
- Members are limited to riding a maximum of two (2) horses per competition.
- NDHD Member classes must be a financial member of NDHD. Participant classes riders must be an EA Member
- Competitive and Interschool Classes, riders must be a Competitive member of EA.
- Bridle numbers are to be worn (EA or Club No) on both sides of the saddle cloth or bridle and must be displayed at all times when tied up or being led the bridle number will be displayed on your halter
- Callers are allowed but riders must make their own arrangements
- Lunging IS ONLY permissible in the round yard near the stable complex
- Northern Districts Hack and Dressage club is operating in compliance with the following Public Health
 Direction Restrictions on Businesses, Activities and Undertakings Direction (No 3) A copy of the

- Neither the Organising committee of this competition to which these rules apply, or the EA, accepts
 any liability for accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any
 other persons or property whatsoever
- If you are unwell the morning of the event, please do not come as we have COVID-19 policies we are required to follow. We must record names & details of everyone who attends on the day. Make sure you Check in to the QR. Spectators must adhere to social distancing rules of 1.5m Sanitiser stations will be on the grounds, please use them & wash your hands regularly.
- BIOSECURITY All Horse owners & competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant. Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home & at the event & to follow the instructions of the Organising Committee & the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event. All horses entering the grounds must be in good health, with no signs of illness. Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Do not share equipment, including food and water containers between horses. Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards & the grounds & placing it in the designated areas. Please use your own shovel/rake. Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Everyone handling the horse should wash or sanitise hands & stop all non essential contact.
